Bryson DeChambeau – No. 1 (2,000 points)

2017-18 season notes:

Wins: 3; the Memorial Tournament presented by Nationwide, THE NORTHERN TRUST, Dell Technologies Championship

Starts: 25

Top-10s: 9

How he qualified for the TOUR Championship:

- Solo runner-up finish at the Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard moved him inside the top 20 for the first time this season
- Turned in back-to-back top-five finishes at the RBC Heritage (T3) and Wells Fargo Championship (4)
- Outlasted Kyle Stanley and Byeong Hun An on the second hole of sudden death to win the Memorial Tournament presented by Nationwide; jumped inside the top 10 in the standings
- Won THE NORTHERN TRUST and Dell Technologies Championship to become the sixth player to win back-to-back FedExCup Playoffs events and the first since Billy Horschel in 2014
- Earned his fourth PGA TOUR win in his 70th career start, the fewest by any player to get four wins since Rory McIlroy (50th start)

- Won his first start of the 2017-18 season, overcoming an eight-stroke final-round deficit to win the World Golf Championships-HSBC Champions
- Returned to the top 10 in the standings following a solo third at the Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard, where he led the field in birdies

- Moved into the No. 2 position with his second win of the season at the Fort Worth Invitational, matching the highest previous position of his career
- Recorded his fourth consecutive top-10 finish with a runner-up result at The Open Championship, where he played the weekend with scores of 64-69 after opening with 72-73
- Made a late charge on Sunday at the Dell Technologies Championship to move from No. 6 back into the coveted top five at No. 3 in the standings

- Claimed top-10 finishes at the first three major championships: Masters (T10), U.S. Open (5), The Open Championship (T9)
- Claimed his first-ever top-10 finish in a World Golf Championships event with a T10 at the WGC-Bridgestone Invitational
- Added his third runner-up finish of the season at THE NORTHERN TRUST to propel him from No. 12 to No. 4 in the standings; Led the field in Stroked Gained: Tee to Green (12.562) and Around-the-Green (+7.800) at The Ridgewood Country Club
- Maintained his position inside the top five with a T4 the following week at the Dell Technologies Championship

Dustin Johnson – No. 4 (1,296 points)

How he qualified for the TOUR Championship:

- After a T2 at the World Golf Championships-HSBC Champions to begin the season, captured the Sentry Tournament of Champions to win on the PGA TOUR for the 11th consecutive year
- Added four more top-10 finishes before collecting a second victory at the FedEx St. Jude Classic in dominant fashion, including holing out from 169 yards on the final hole for an eagle
- Earned the top spot in the FedExCup standings the following week with a solo third in the U.S. Open, a position he held for five weeks
- Won the RBC Canadian Open for his third victory of the season, making it the third season in a row with three or more wins on his resume
- Ended the Regular Season as the FedExCup standings leader

How he qualified for the TOUR Championship:

- Won his second start of the season at the inaugural CJ CUP @ NINE BRIDGES where he defeated Marc Leishman in a sudden-death playoff to jump to No. 3 in the standings

- Captured The Honda Classic in a playoff over Luke List to secure his second consecutive season with multiple wins and take control of the top spot in the FedExCup standings, which he held for eight weeks
- Finished second in the World Golf Championships-Mexico Championship to Phil Mickelson and fourth in the World Golf Championships-Dell Technologies Match Play in back-to-back starts
- Recorded his first win in a World Golf Championships event at the Bridgestone Invitational
- Apart from the first week of the season, never dropped below ninth in the FedExCup standings

- Posted his best result in eight starts at THE PLAYERS Championship, recording a final-round 66 to move up 19 spots on the leaderboard en route to a T7 finish
- En route to a fourth-place result at the RBC Canadian Open, become the first player since Derek Lamely (2011/CareerBuilder Challenge) to make five or more eagles in a stroke-play event on TOUR
- Earned his first TOUR win in six years (2012/WGC-Bridgestone Invitational) with a playoff win over Justin Rose at the BMW Championship

- Became the first repeat winner of the U.S. Open since Curtis Strange in 1989 with his win at Shinnecock Hills
- In his 100th start on the PGA TOUR, became just the fifth player to win the U.S. Open and PGA Championship in the same year
- Sandwiched a solo fifth at the World Golf Championships-Bridgestone Invitational and a T8 at THE NORTHERN TRUST around his victory at the PGA Championship

- Defeated Kevin Kisner 7 and 6 in the championship match at the World Golf Championships-Dell Technologies Match Play for his second win in four starts and second career WGC title
- Claimed his third Travelers Championship title with a three-shot victory in June for his third win of the season and 12th of his career
- Began the final round six shots back of Paul Casey at the Travelers Championship but posted a final-round 63 for the come-from-behind victory
- Recorded a T7 at the Dell Technologies Championship to remain inside the top 10 of the FedExCup standings

How he qualified for the TOUR Championship:

- After missing five cuts in six starts heading into the RBC Heritage, Horschel carded a T5 finish at Harbour Town Golf Links and moved from No. 160 to No. 111 in the FedExCup standings
- Followed up his T5 finish at RBC Heritage with a T11 finish at the Valero Texas Open and a victory at the Zurich Classic of New Orleans alongside teammate Scott Piercy. The duo shot a final-round 5-under 67 (Foursomes) to win by one stroke over Jason Dufner/Pat Perez at TPC Louisiana, giving Horschel his fifth PGA TOUR victory. The win gave him a huge boost in the FedExCup standings, from No. 100 to No. 33
- In his first start at the Barbasol Championship, posted scores of 65-66-68-67—266 (-22) to finish T2 with Richy Werenski and Tom Lovelady
- Tied Cameron Smith for third place at THE NORTHERN TRUST, his best result in the FedExCup Playoffs since winning the TOUR Championship in 2014. The finish propelled him inside the top 20 in the standings (14)

How he qualified for the TOUR Championship:

- Has posted 14 top-25 finishes and eight top-10 finishes this season, missing only three cuts
- Won THE PLAYERS Championship by four strokes for his fifth career PGA TOUR title in his 250th start, cracking the top 10 in the standings (No.8). Was tied for the lead with five others at the end of first round before setting tournament records for largest 36-hole lead (5 strokes; previous: 4, Jason Day/2016) and 54-hole lead (7 strokes; previous: 5, Alex Cejka/2009). Never ranked worse than No. 12 in the standings for the remainder of the season
- Shot a final-round 62 at the Wyndham Championship—where he earned his first professional victory in 2011 and just down the road from his alma mater Wake Forest—to finish tied for second. This marked his sixth top-10 in his 10th start at the event and second consecutive top-five (T2/2018, 3rd/2017)

- Followed up his victory in San Diego with a T2 finish at the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am
- Recorded his second victory of the season with a two-shot win at the Wells Fargo Championship for his 12th career PGA TOUR title
- Followed up his victory in Charlotte with a T5 finish at THE PLAYERS Championship to maintain his second-place spot in the FedExCup standings
- Recorded six consecutive top-20 finishes before missing the cut at the Dell Technologies Championship, which was only his second missed cut of the season

Francesco Molinari – No. 13 (352 points)

How he qualified for the TOUR Championship:

- Recorded a final-round 62 to win the Quicken Loans National by eight strokes over Ryan Armour for his first career PGA TOUR victory. Became the first Italian to win on TOUR since Toney Penna in 1947. Bettered previous tournament records for 72-hole score (259), 54-hole score (197; tied with Abraham Ancer after three rounds) and margin of victory (8). Moved inside the Top 50 in the FedExCup standings with the victory (No. 42)
- Just one week after his maiden TOUR victory, Molinari posted a T2 finish at the John Deere Classic in his first appearance at the event, as he was looking to become the first player to have his first two victories come in back-to-back starts since 2008 (Camilo Villegas/BMW Championship, TOUR Championship)
- Entered the final round of the Open Championship three strokes off the lead but carded the only bogey-free final round (69) to card an 8-under total and win by two strokes over four players at 6-under. This victory marked his third win in six worldwide starts and the first major championship victory by an Italian player
- In the span of 21 days, Molinari moved from 123rd to 7th in the FedExCup standings
- Looking to win back-to-back major championships, posted scores of 68-67-68-67—270 (-10) at the PGA Championship to claim a share of sixth place with Thomas Pieters, Gary Woodland and defending champion Justin Thomas
